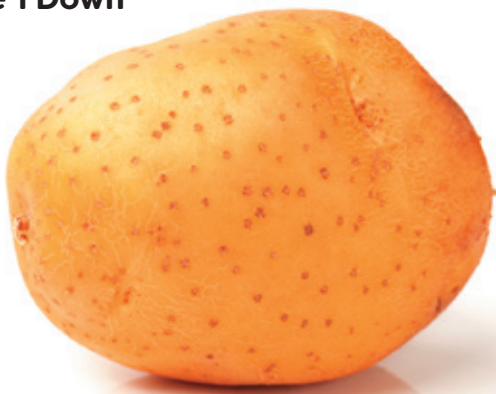

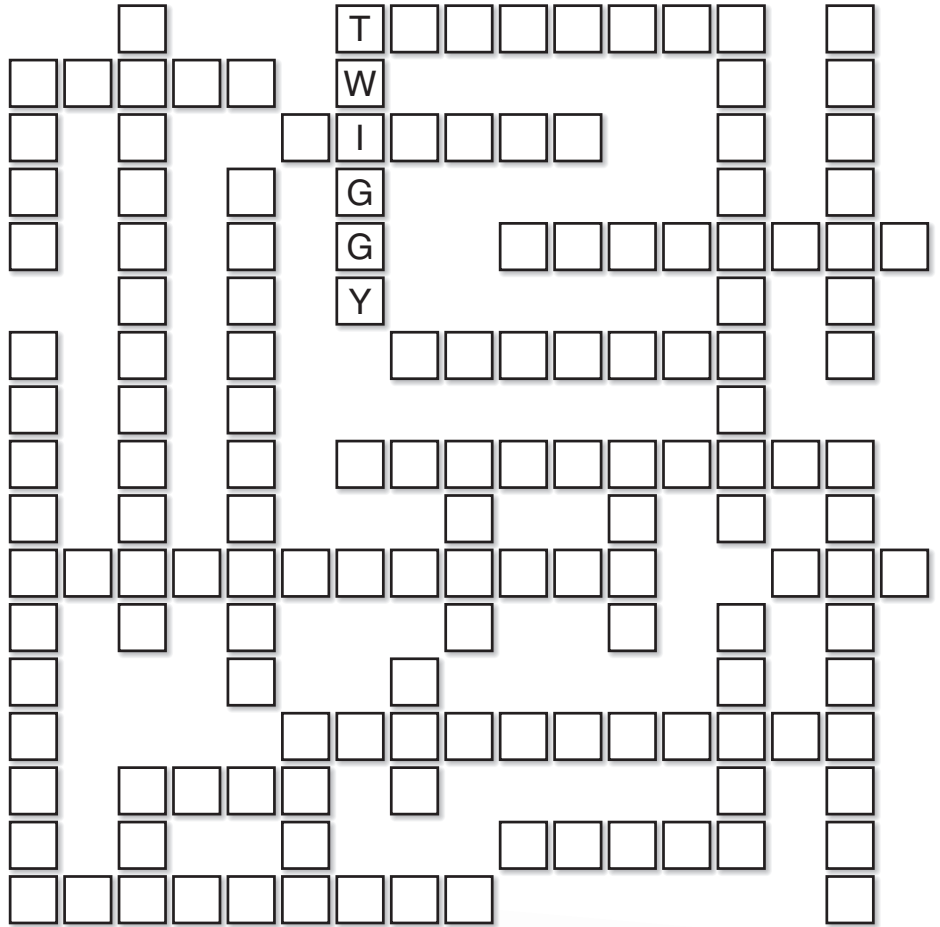

FILM FUN

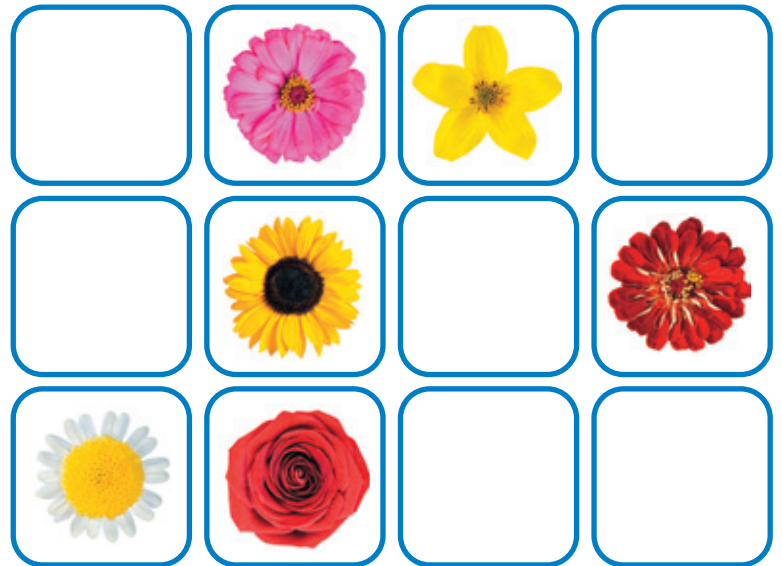
Study this Marx Brothers film poster for a minute, then turn the page to see if you can answer the questions.

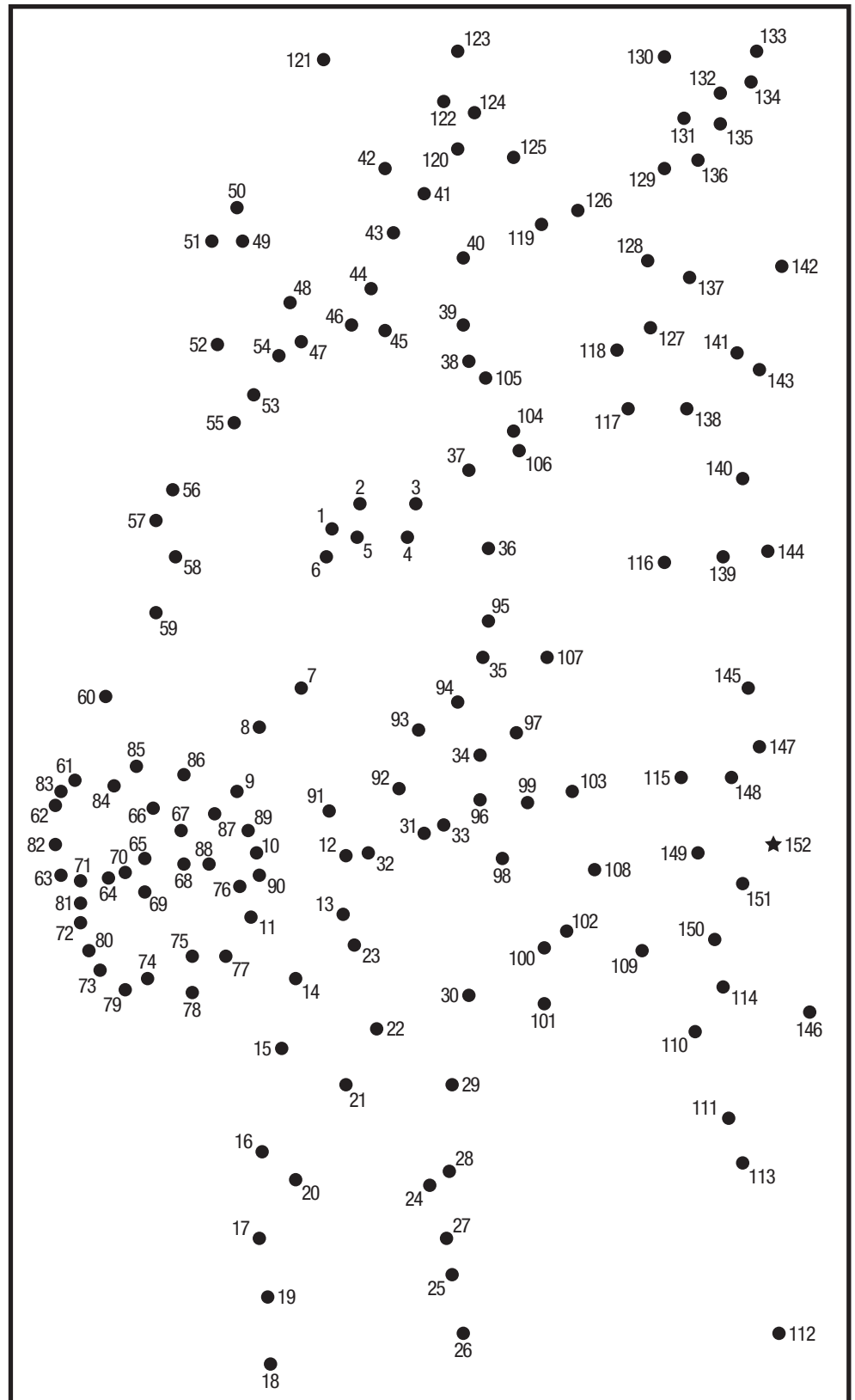

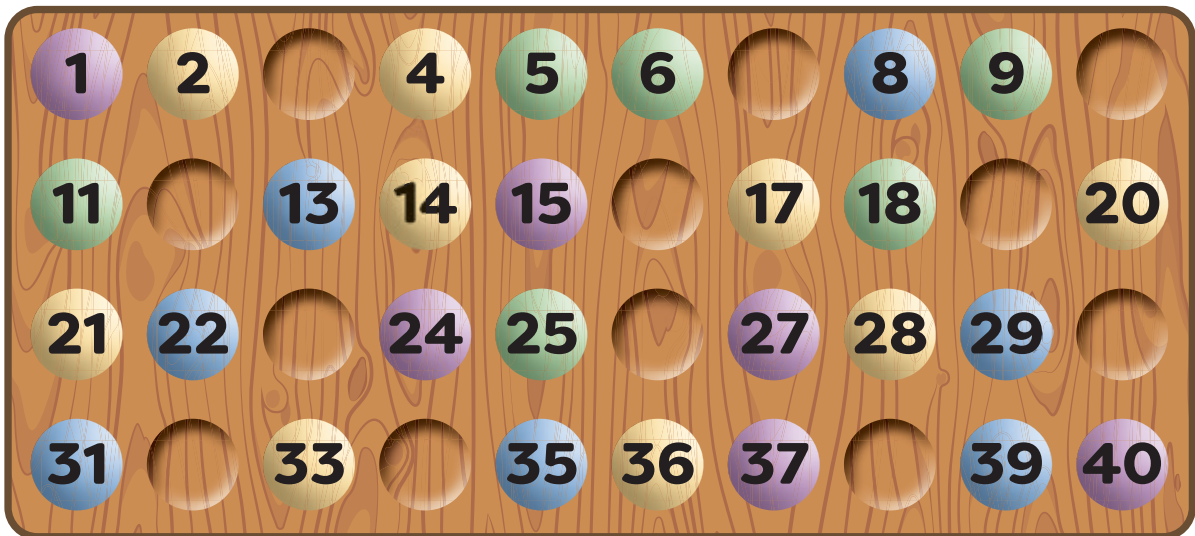
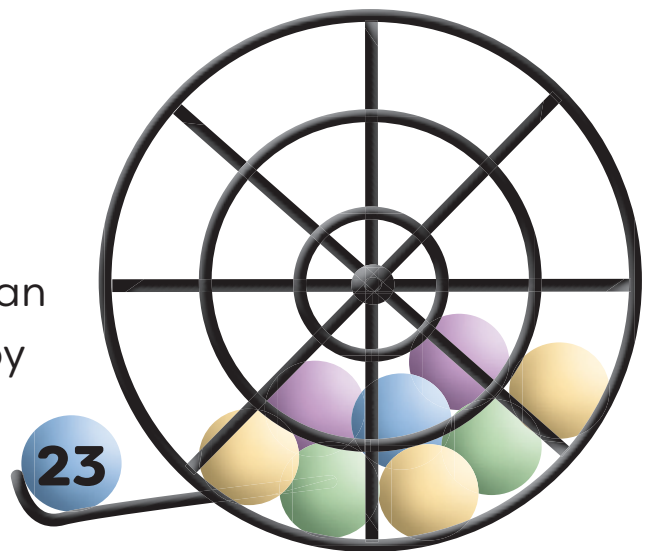

MAKE AND BAKE

Enjoy this quick and easy recipe to make the classic Spotted Dick.

Ingredients

95g/3.5oz of self-raising flour
90g/3oz of butter
75g/2.5oz of sultanas
60g/2oz of currants
60g/2oz of fresh breadcrumbs
4 tablespoons of caster sugar
half a teaspoon of mixed spice
pinch of salt
125ml of milk

Equipment

Mixing bowl
Pudding bowl
Large saucepan
Kitchen foil

Method

Add the self-raising flour, breadcrumbs, caster sugar, salt, mixed spice, sultanas, currants and butter to a mixing bowl and mix together well.

Add the milk and combine to form a soft dough.

Place the mixture into a buttered pudding bowl of about one litre capacity then cover with foil.

Bring a large saucepan of water to the boil then place a saucer in upside down to keep the pudding bowl off the bottom of the pan.

Lower the pudding in and leave it to boil for two hours, adding additional water as it evaporates.

When cooked, remove the pudding bowl from the water, turn the spotted dick pudding upside down onto a plate and serve with custard.
